- (1) 73 % the teachers have assessed as excellent by the students regarding their responsibility towards completion of the course, whereas 22 % have assess as good.
- (2) 80 % teachers have assessed as excellent by the students regarding their responsibility towards attending the classroom, whereas 15 % have assess as good.
- (3) 82 % the teachers have assessed as excellent by the students regarding their responsibility towards analytically discussing relevant topics presented briefly hinted upon in the text book, whereas 15 % have assess as good.
- (4) 75 % the teachers have assessed as excellent by the students regarding their responsibility towards explaining the significance of glossary terms found in the text book, whereas 20 % have assess as good.
- (5) 68 % the teachers have assessed as excellent by the students regarding incorporation of humour from the perspective of presentation skill of the teachers, whereas 24 % have assess as good.
